
Fresh fruits and vegetables purchased by schools using their USDA Dollars, Planned Assistance Level (PAL).



About the DoD Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program

- The program allows schools to use USDA Foods entitlement dollars to buy fresh produce. The program is operated by the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) at the Department of Defense.
- In school year (SY) 1994-1995, the program began as a pilot in eight states;
 \$3.2 million of produce was delivered to schools. Today, schools in 46 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, and Guam participate in the program.
- No cap on DoD, currently almost \$200,000,000 per school year, projected to continue the trend up.
